WHAT DOES THIS CAREER LOOK LIKE?

Healthcare professionals are individuals that work in medicine and related fields. Apart from delivering direct medical care, healthcare professionals also work within hospitals, doctors' offices, clinics, or in homes to make sure the business of healthcare runs smoothly. In addition to your typical, direct care positions, healthcare institutions also employ many STEM careers (see STEM career page) such as IT, engineers, data analytics and other Humanities careers (See Humanities career page) such as Social Workers.

Healthcare professionals tend to have strong math and science skills, analytical skills, and attention to detail. Healthcare professionals are expected to be able to work independently and part of a team and have a strong desire to help others.

Work environment:

Healthcare professionals work in hospitals, in doctor's offices, in patient homes, in nursing homes, in health promotion, and in offices within hospitals.



WHAT DOES THIS CAREER LOOK LIKE?

People that work in STEM have strong math, science, technical, and problem-solving skills and work well independently and in a team. STEM careers include, but are not limited to, Engineering (Mechanical, Electrical, Civil, Computer, Biomedical, etc), Manufacturing, Information Technology, Software Development, Environmental Science, Clean Energy, Data Analytics, Agriculture and Healthcare (see previous section).

Depending on the STEM career or work setting, some other key skills include: statistics, comfort with computers and technology, knowledge of complicated machinery, awareness of safety, computer coding, design systems (i.e. CAD), problem solving, creativity, outside-the-box thinking, and flexibility.

Work environment:

Working in STEM, you can be in an office, a manufacturing floor, research/test labs, or in the field. You can work for a STEM company specifically, or a different company doing STEM work.



WHAT DOES THIS CAREER LOOK LIKE?

People that work in skilled trades and construction see the impact of their work all around them. Every person has a need for the skills that people in this field possess at some point in their lives. As a skilled trade worker and/or construction worker, you can expect to work with people, be called in on emergency situations, and need to adapt to on-the-job changes very often. People that work in skilled trades/construction and transportation/warehousing should have excellent planning and organization skills, and interest in math, science, and technical concepts/technology. Experience with financing and productivity, time management, problem solving, and teamwork skills are important for someone working in transportation or warehousing.

Work environment:

In construction: work environments range depending on the types of projects you work on - this can range from factories and warehouses to people's homes or small businesses, to a construction site for a large project.

For transportation and warehousing, typically, the work environment will be a warehouse or a vehicle. Long hours may be expected for long-haul truck drivers whose routes span several states. Nighttime hours may be expected for warehouse employees.



WHAT DOES THIS CAREER LOOK LIKE?

Working in business requires good organization, finance, and people skills. Included in this category is hospitality, professional services, marketing, graphic design, sales, food service, cosmotology, retail, finance, accounting, entrepreneurship, and more.

Businesses can be a sole entrepreneur or over 5,000 employees, so the job duties and experience are varied. Your salary is also not necessarily dependent on your degree level as it is with many other fields.

Work environment:

Marketing, communication, and business is necessary in all work environments – you could be working in any size business that sells any kind of product. Graphic design and good writing and math skills are all important for people working in communications, marketing, and/or business. People skills, management skills, and time management are integral for this field.



WHAT DOES THIS CAREER LOOK LIKE?

Working in education requires interaction with children and adults looking to further their knowledge and job capabilities. Being a teacher is not the only option in education - many support staff and other specialists are needed to provide a good school environment.

Working in public administration and government gives you the ability to make change in your community. In these kinds of jobs, you'll interact with the community and work to make laws and programs to create the change you want.

Working in human services allows you to help people in the community that need services or counseling. All of these fields require leadership, communication, problem solving, and emotional intelligence.

Work environment:

Working in a school or department of education requires a focus on the well-being and knowledge gain of students. Teamwork and continuous learning is encouraged.

Working in government requires good communication skills. You will be working in a state, city, or county office building.

Working in human services can involve independent organizations, government contracting, or affiliation with a school or government.


